

2022 UHA Annual Meeting  
January 23, 2022  
Outpost Performance Space  
2:00 to 3:50 p.m.

Attendees: 16 neighborhood and area residents and business people, eight Albuquerque Police Department officials (including Jose Brionez (Crime Prevention Specialist), Sgt. Julie Maycumber and six Officers), State Senator Antoinette Sedillo Lopez, and State Representative Gail Chasey.

1. Board Member Mandy Warr called the meeting to order welcomed everyone.
2. Jose Brionez stated that Luke Languit is the new Southeast Area Commander and discussed recent crime statistics. Sgt. Maycumber discussed the upcoming bid process and that officers would be working 12-hour shifts. She stated that more than 200 officers had left the force in the past year, and that none of her squad had been with APD for more than two years. She also addressed a variety of questions, including what's the current priority (criminal trespass) and ongoing crime problems and some of the new methods, including "Star Chase" darts for fleeing vehicles. She stated that there is some attempt to add new Public Safety Assistants (PSAs), which she hopes will result in more field officers.
3. Rep. Gail Chasey and Sen. Antoinette Sedillo Lopez discussed some issues in this year's legislative session, including that they would again be proposing funding for Lead and Coal safety enhancements. The two legislators are disappointed in the lack of progress on Lead and Coal safety improvements and heard a lot of concerns about the lack of responsiveness to neighborhood concerns. They committed to seeing what directions to the city can be included with this year's appropriation. They will also communicate directly with Mayor Keller and Councilor Davis about our continuing concerns about Lead and Coal and rest-in-red, including additional measures suggested by new neighborhood resident Ronald Czelusniak.
4. Joseph Aguirre discussed the on-going work of the Lead and Coal Safety Brigade towards accountability of city officials responsible for improvements and the Road Safety Audit not being completed, though it had been promised.
5. Don Hancock explained that Councilor Pat Davis was unable to attend because he had to isolate for a few days because of exposure to covid-19. He wanted to be sure that everyone was aware of the ongoing University Metropolitan Redevelopment Area and the upcoming first virtual public meeting on Wednesday, February 2 at 5:30 pm.
6. Other neighborhood concerns were discussed by attendees.
7. Election of board members: Ten members were elected, with the officers to be selected by the board. The board is:
