It is important that all residents of the neighborhood plan on attending the annual meeting whether you rent or own, or operate a business in University Heights. The UHA Board participates in a variety of issues that affect the neighborhood: zoning, crime, the Lead/Coal project, parking permits, and redistricting, to name a few. We ensure that our local government representatives understand the concerns of our neighborhood.

By attending the annual meeting, you can hear from your local officials and share your concerns for the neighborhood, and even join the board yourself (elections are held during our annual meeting ).

In 2011 we held our annual Summer Block Party and TWO Neighborhood Cleanups, one that included a Barbeque and we started a Neighborhood Patrol. Members of our board represented our neighborhood at city meetings on Crime and Safety and the Lead/Coal construction project. We even met with the Mayor to discuss options to save the historic Werner-Gilchrist House, and to encourage the City to resume distributing parking permits at our Block Party. The UHA Board will continue to move forward fighting for the rights of our neighborhood and representing our neighbors' concerns.

In a democracy it is essential for people to participate: too often we feel as though our voices are not being heard. By getting involved with the neighborhood association you can help decide what happens in our neighborhood. Serving as the president this past year has been a joy.

## REMINDERS



**PARKING:** Residents of the University Heights area are reminded that blocking the sidewalk is not allowed—you could be ticketed! Please park your cars so they do not interfere with pedestrians. A friendly reminder to a neighbor may solve the problem, but a call to Parking Enforcement at 924-3950 may be necessary.

If you have a service worker coming to your house you can also call Parking Enforcement to request a waiver so that the service worker's vehicle will not be ticketed.

Work on the Lead and Coal improvements was delayed by December's wet weather and, as a result, completion may not meet the original March target date. Also, for safety reasons, residents are being asked to avoid the construction area. Pedestrians specifically are asked to use the new completed sidewalks on Coal Ave. Regarding a separate concern, vehicles parked on completed sidewalks or landscaping are receiving written reminders to use designated parking areas only.
