I. Preliminary Items

New City Neighborhood Recognition Ordinance (NARO) – At the September 20 City Council meeting there were lots of amendment discussed and passed, but final passage failed by a 5-4 vote (Benton, Davis, Gibson, and Jones). So the "old" NARO remains in effect. C. Zoning – Still nothing on Near Heights Planning Assessment. Next revision of IDO has started. Meetings are being held and comments can be submitted until October 15. City staff draft application will be on October 28. EPC Public hearing is December 9. Gene sent an email saying that he agrees with Gary Eyster of Nob Hill that increasing front fence height from 3' to 4' is not a good idea. Gene sent a link for people who'd like to make online comments by October 15.
