STAY INFORMED

Lead and Coal Update: As of May 7 the New Vision redesign of Lead and Coal Avenues is awaiting the imminent formal release of the federal dollars which will largely fund the project. Once that happens the project will be advertised and go to bid. Once the general contractor is selected the contractor and the city will develop a schedule for the project which will include: 1) which sections of the roadway will be done in what order; and 2) plans for traffic as the project proceeds. The city has estimated around 2 months from when the project is advertised to when construction starts. Given various projections, construction appears likely not to commence until July or, more likely, August. Total duration of the construction phase of the project has been estimated at 18 to 24 months.

The city has stated that a public information meeting will be scheduled as the project moves into construction. The next UHA newsletter update regarding Lead Coal will not be until August. Questions about the project may be directed to:
